UC's co-op program connects students' academic studies to a series of meaningful professional experiences through alternating semesters of full-time (35 hours/week), paid positions related to their major. It's an educational partnership among UC, employers, and students.


Access the latest talent pool

Cooperative education connects employers with students to fill some of the most challenging positions to recruit and hire for today. Students are available year-round on a semester basis (typically 15–17 weeks).
